Christianity is Nothing without Love

A while ago, I wrote on Love and Maturity as true Children of God. I wanted to write more on this issue as I see people worshipping God but yet cannot show their Love toward others, while on the other hand I hear people confess their love on others yet they do not truly believe and serve God. Which is which? Where do we Christians belong?

Now, I would like to entertain and dwell on the sayings that I read that says "if you cannot love people (with their mistakes and imperfection or race and nationality), you cannot love God." Loving people and the willingness to overlook their weaknesses is what we have to focus on. Who among us are perfect before we can start loving? Can't we not accept the idea that all struggle and have weaknesses? Can't we not just be an encouragement to others so the word of God can be everyone's guide to make our lives right? If "AGAPE" love is unconditional love, it is Not based on emotion at all. This is a decision we make to love another person whether they love us back or not - it means that "we Christians" must love somebody even if he is your enemy. JK Rowling said exactly what we needed to know to show the true love in us when he said, "if you want to know what a man's like, take a look at how he treats his inferiors, not equals."

There is a common concept that we can only love those who flatter our ego directly or indirectly – meaning, we simply focus on the extension of our "self love."
