Reality: Living with Differences

We realize that we exist in this world not only alone but with many different people. The cause of many conflicts today is because of selfishness on the part of people wanting to cause chaos and turmoil and on the part of those who want to protect their lives. The recent issue about "banning some Muslim immigrants" is caused by evil people who caused so many death to a peace loving country or either "leaders who only look selfishly at their own." What is the effect of this on other countries? Are all living in those "banned countries" evil and deserved to be banned? Must all these Muslims be banned because they belong to predominant Muslims? However, can a country also decide what is best for their own and push the policy anyway? Questions and Answers can never end but we can only be aware that "this is the World we are in." It is a world of so many differences!

The gospel has taught us about keeping the commandments while living with or among people with different values, beliefs and practices. Our knowledge about conflict and differences are common and accepted, yet the Savior did not limit His warning against contention to those who were not keeping the commandment. Many times we Christians encounter conflicts but even as we seek to be meek and avoid conflicts, we must not melt down and compromise our commitment to the truth that we carry. We must not give up our Biblical positions and values. We are in a war and it is a spiritual war. Let us brace ourselves with God's teaching to strengthen us and give us the strength to go on and continue doing God's word. The word, our only weapon and encouragement, is a "Two edged sword" and has made us combatants in the eternal warfare between truth and error. There is no middle ground or "bystander" in this war.

In our Bible study, our Savior showed the way when His adversaries confronted Him with the woman who had been "taken in adultery, in the very act" in John 8:4. After they were shamed with their own hypocrisy, the accusers withdrew and left Jesus alone with the woman. He treated her with kindness by declining to condemn her at that time but Jesus also strongly told her to "sin no more." Brethren, "Loving-kindness" is so needed, but we, followers of Christ—must be strong in upholding and spreading the truth. Peace be with you!
