FAITHFULNESS is one Ingredient for a Strong Marriage

Hardly in our world today, we see men and women who will stand by their word. Truthfulness is almost rare and Christians are not even spared by this problem. One can tell who they are and what kind of people they are when their patience is tested. Charles Stanley says, "Too many Christians have a commitment of convenience. They'll stay faithful as long as it's safe and doesn't involve risk, rejection, or criticism. Instead of standing alone in the face of challenge or temptation, they check to see which way their friends are going."

I want us Christians to dwell on "faithfulness", for us to see ourselves and where we are heading. When a person marries his/her partner, his commitment must be pure and true and not a commitment of convenience. However, we see so much divorce, conflict and children suffering because of "unfaithfulness." Francois de La Rochefoucauld says, "When a man must force himself to be faithful in his love, this is hardly better than unfaithfulness." One cannot force himself to be faithful. It is a choice we have long chosen. Why? Faithfulness goes with, honesty, commitment, patience, sincerity and dedication. This is for a lifetime commitment, promise, dedication....and so on. In the first place, our decision to love someone is within us and must stand with a strong foundation. Dictionary says "Faithfulness" means true to one's word, promises, vows, steady in allegiance or affection; loyal; constant: reliable, trusted, or believed. When a person cannot be faithful to his/her partner, what assurance can he/she give that the next person will be for a lifetime?

According to one friend, "this is a disposable relationship." Does it mean, people are disposable? And as times and years build up having good memories and most especially "children", are they also disposable? What problems can't be solved if both are faithful and true to their commitment? Paul said in Ephesians 5:33(New International Version) Nevertheless, each individual among you also is to love his own wife even as himself, and the wife must see to it that she respects her husband. In the Old Testament, Ruth said, "Do not urge me to leave you or turn back from following you; for where you go, I will go, and where you lodge, I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God, my God. "Where you die, I will die, and there I will be buried. Thus may the LORD do to me, and worse, if anything but death parts you and me." When she saw that she was determined to go with her, she said no more to her (Ruth 1:16-18: New International Version).

If married couples carry these principles and passages, staying together will never be a problem. Their lifetime commitment will not be rocked by any trial. The, relationship will never be like disposable plates, spoons and cups – thrown to the garbage after use. It will always be a relationship cherished, valued, flourishing and blessed with good children. That is what our God wants to see.
